Preparation for Transition

Welcome to Term 3!

Welcome to Term 3. We would like to welcome back our new and returning subscribers to our newsletter.

This term continues to be packed with fun filled activities as well as a number of exciting events. We will continue to provide activities and experiences for the child's complete development as well as the enhancement of children's literacy and numeracy skills. We will also be extending children's knowledge of letters and the sounds that they make. Children will be provided with experiences that develop their skills in recognising different phonemes (sounds)



in words and exploring rhyming words. While in numeracy, the focus will be on extending children's knowledge and understanding of shapes, numbers and measuring through hands on games and activities. These will all assist in the transition process.

Transition can be seen as an ongoing process that has a number of steps and can be made more successful when the adults in children's lives recognize its importance and plan for it thoughtfully and carefully. Moving from a known, comfortable environment to one that is different and unfamiliar is challenging, especially if careful attention is not given to the transition. In addition, the more different the settings are the more difficult that transition may be. Therefore, a positive school entry increases the chance for a successful school experience. A well-planned transition benefits children, families, teachers, and builds trust and relationships for the whole school community.

With this in mind, this term we will be focusing on transitioning that prepares the child for successful interaction with their peers, families and teachers.

Materials: paper, glue, popsicle sticks, cup, Bristol board/cardboard, crayons, pencils, scissors, chairs, cloth, bread, vegetables, cheese, deli meats/vegetarian meats

Activities for three (3) and four (4) year olds—PART 1

Monday

Story Sequence

- Adult will read the story entitled "My First Day At School" to the child
- Using the pictures,
 sequence the order of the routines in the story







Physical Activity: Action Cup

- Using the child's favourite cup write and stick the words Action Cup on it
- Child will stick pictures of routines on Popsicle sticks
- Child will choose a Popsicle stick and demonstrate the action



Tuesday

Creating my schedule on a clock

- Children will draw pictures of their daily remote learning schedule (three-year-olds will stick pictures)
- Allow the child to follow the picture to create his/her own daily schedule clock
- Children's activities would involve children's preparation for the day, circle time, individual activity, fruit time, outdoor play, stories and rhymes, lunch break and clean-up and recall



Physical Activity: Do you know what time it is?

- Sing the song, Do you know what time it is? (to the tune of the Muffin Man)
- Using the schedule clock, the child created, spin the hand and have the child do the action the hand lands on

Wednesday

My personal routine

- Child will cut out the pictures and sort them in the order of their daily routines
- Four-year-olds can number the pictures and place in order

Thursday

Dramatising a bus ride

- Place chairs in a similar order like a bus
- Use strips of cloth to make seat belts on the chair
- Child will enter the bus and put on his/her seat belt
- Adult will pretend to drive the child to school
- Discuss what will be seen as they drive through the community





Friday

Making a Sandwich

- The child can create any of the sandwiches seen in the pictures









Physical Activity: Wheels on the Bus

- Follow the song as seen in the picture and do the actions



Physical Activity:

- Using the words in the song, the child will sing and demonstrate the actions
