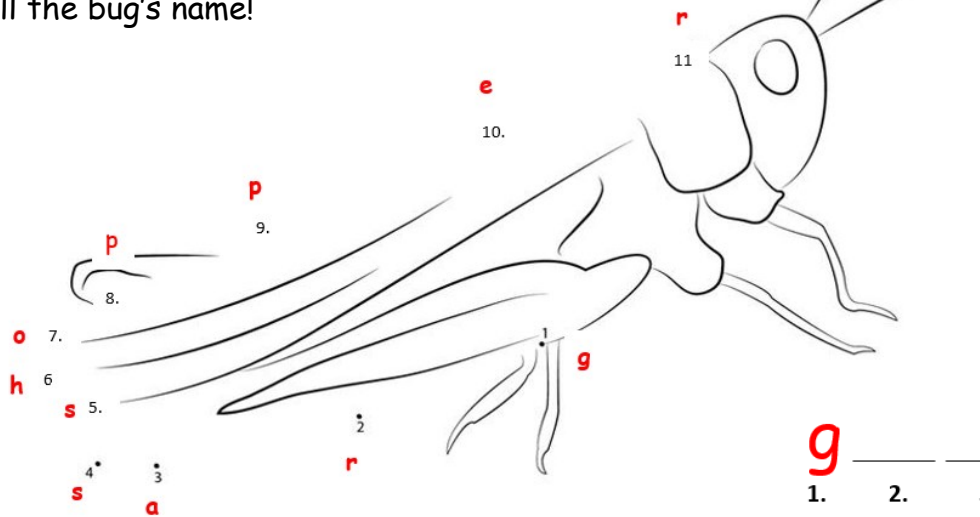

Answer: **T**he cat ran fast.

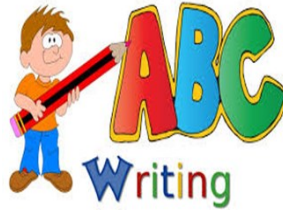

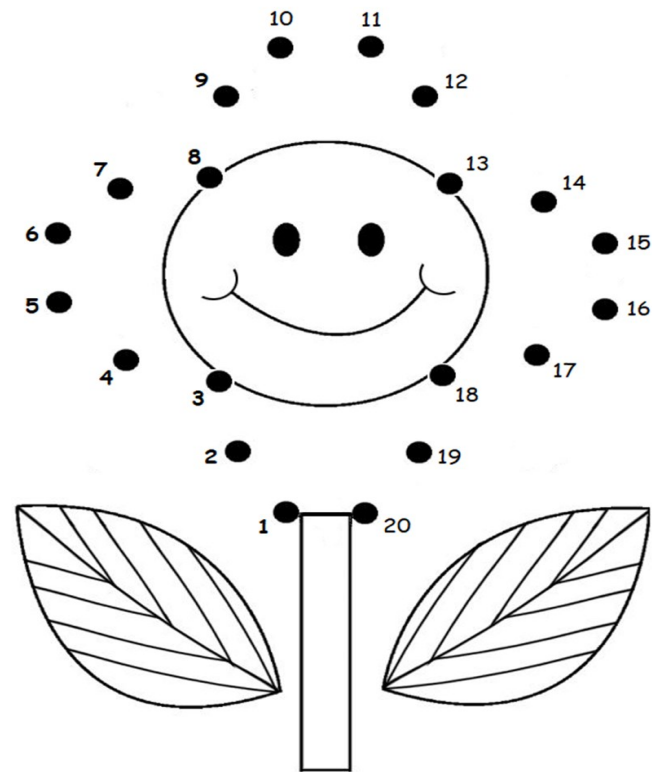
