to teach our students how to behave in an online space.




Netiquette is made-up of two words:

Why is Netiquette important?

The rules for an online environment are different from those that apply when communicating in person.

There are expected ways for how students should behave during online classes.

Netiquette:

- provides guidelines for users
- · suggests acceptable online behaviour
- prevents disrespect
- protects users from cyberbullying



Who is a cyberbully?

A cyberbully is someone who uses a device to send messages to another person that cause them fear, anxiety and feelings of hurt. This can be harmful to their health and cause them to feel bad about themselves.






Remember, listening and replying to what others have to say is very important in the online environment.










How many do I see?






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Capital letters and question marks



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Let us look at some common rules when

attending school online:

1. Pay attention. This can be hard since we are not directly in front of our teacher like in a physical classroom. Try to avoid being distracted by other classmates or playing online games.

2. Be part of the class by asking or answeringquestions. Teachers like when students do this. It

shows that you are interested and would like to understand wha is being taught.

3. Be on time. Log in at least 10 to 15 minutes before class begins.

4. Sit properly. Sometimes, we start off by sitting properly but by

the end of the school day, we begin to slouch. Bad posture leads to many health issues, like neck pain and back pain.

This image shows the correct sitting posture:

- Head- eyes level with top of monitor
- Arms- shoulders down elbows close to body
- Chair sit back in chair
- Legs- thighs parallel to the floor
- Feet- flat on floor
- Keep your workspace neat and tidy in the event your teacher asks you to turn on your camera.

6. Let those at home know when you are class. You can make a simple sign to remind them.



7. Be respectful to your teachers and classmates. Remember to use words like please, thank you and excuse me. Do not 'talk over' another person.

8. Use Caps Lock keyboard feature properly when you are writing or sending a message. Avoid using all capital letters. In an online environment, this says you are angry and shouting at the person you are writing to.

9. When writing a message, ask yourself these questions to ensure you are being polite and respectful.



10.It is important to treat others the way we want to be treated.

This is "The Golden Rule".

By following these simple rules, we can be better students in class. These rules also help us to make and keep friends in this new learning space.
