The Local Government Election You and Your Community


In an election people vote for someone. For example, citizens can vote for or choose the Prime Minister.

In the local government elections, adults (18 years old and over) vote for persons to do things for the communities in which they and others live.

Your street, road, trace, avenue, boulevard or lane is a part of your community.

The Local Government Election takes place on 25th January this year, in 5 areas of Trinidad and all of Tobago.

The Local Government Councillor is the person who is elected to serve the members of a community. He/she works with members of the community to improve that area.

Local Government Councillors can be young, old, male or female. They can be your neighbour, parent or relative.

Schools have prefects. A prefect is a leader. The students vote for their prefect. The prefect helps to make sure the school children follow the rules.




Sound of Letter 'e'

How do we know which object is longer or shorter?


Place them side by side to measure their lengths. Start at the same point.




Our Money

Draw missing bills to show the value of a \$10 dollar bill. One is done for you.









Write 1, 2, 3 or 4 in each box to order the objects by length. Use 1 for the object with the shortest length and 4 for the object with the longest length.




Using 10 as a Reference
