

They were used to transport or carry:








The most unusual train carried was a circus train. The train took the circus to San Fernando on the 2<sup>nd</sup> February 1923, complete with animals, tents and performers.


There were railway lines between various points in the country which helped passengers (people) move around.





This is the Public Transport Service Corporation Building (PTSC).

Its old name was the Trinidad Government Railway Building.

It is located in South Quay, Port of Spain.

We now use it every day to take a bus or maxi-taxi to go to and from school or work. Long ago many persons boarded the train from this spot to take them from Port of Spain to San Fernando, Arima and Sangre Grande.



The last train journey or ride was on August 30<sup>th</sup> 1965. The fare or cost was 70 cents. The train left from Port of Spain to San Fernando at 5.12 pm and was 37 minutes late. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=sdkz-

Ms. Chanel Gopaul is a doctor. She works at the Port-of-Spain General hospital. She treats sick people and makes them feel better.






Ms. Donna-Marie Bahadoor is a pharmacist. She owns a pharmacy. She gives expert advice on the use of medicines.
