Speak positively about your community.




Get together with family and neighbours to keep your community clean, e.g. adopt a park.















Infant 2 - Let's Count Forward and Backward


Count forward: 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10

Remember count forward and backward! Follow the examples.








Showing loyalty to family and friends

Loyalty begins in the home. We must be loyal to our parents/guardians, grandparents, brothers, sisters and the other people we may live with. Just like our family, we must also be loyal to our friends. Let us look at some ways that we can be loyal to our family and friends.

Let us now look at why a person is not being loyal in examples 4 and 6.



Showing loyalty
